


WEEKLY PROPANE SUPPLY-DEMAND-PRICE TRENDS




Summary: Wholesale demand decreased -20,000 bpd last week, to the low end of the historic range.



Production increased +21,000 bpd on the week, and remains above the historic range.




Imports jumped +102,000 bpd with the increase concentrated in PADDs 1 & 2.




Combined production and imports during the latest 4-wk period were +151,000 bpd above a year ago. Imports declined -9,000 bpd during the period, offset by a +160,000 bpd rise in

production. The latest 4-wk average demand was -7,000 bpd below last year.

Stocks increased +2.8 million barrels on the week, with builds in all regions. The latest 4-wk stock change was a build of 9.3 million barrels, a record build for this time of year. Stock levels are above four of the last five years.



Price and Spreads Mt Belvieu and Conway prices decreased -1.5 cts/gal each for the week ending 11May10.




The Conway – Mt Belvieu price spread trended lower on the week ending 11May10. The spread ended the week below the 5-year range.

The propane to natural gas price spread trended lower on the week. The level remains exceptionally high in favor of propane.


The propane / crude oil price spread spiked higher on a collapse in prompt month crude oil prices. The level ending the week at the mid range.

PADD 1 stocks increased +1.6 million barrels on the week. A +90,000 bpd jump in imports contributed to the increase. Production decreased -21,000 bpd to the low end of the historic range.

Combined production and imports are near year ago levels for the latest 4-wk period. Stock levels are at record highs. PADD 2 stocks increased +0.7 million barrels last week. Combined imports and production increased +6,000 bpd last week. Supply was +25,000 bpd above last year for the latest 4-wk period. The most recent 4-wk stock build of +4.3 million barrels was a record build for this time of year. Stock levels are near the 5-year high for the period.



PAD 3 stocks increased +0.4 million barrels last week. Production increased +53,000 bpd on the week, with the 4-wk average +130,000 bpd above last year. Stock levels are above the mid range.



PADDs 4 & 5 stocks were unchanged on the week. Stock levels are below the mid range.

Emerging Trends show a sharp increase in production, which exceeds the 5-year high for the past 6-wks. Stocks continue to build at a record rate with PADD 2 levels near the 5-year high for the period. These trends should lead price weakness over the nest 60-days.








U. S. Propane Supply and Demand Balance




PADD 1 Propane Supply and Demand Balance




PADD 2 Propane Supply and Demand Balance




PADD 3 Propane Supply and Demand Balance
